Basic Ability Test (BAT) Cost \$40.00

Effective January 1, 2002, individuals seeking entry into the Law Enforcement Basic Recruit Training, Corrections Basic Recruit Training and Cross Training to Law Enforcement or Corrections programs will be required to successfully complete a Basic Ability Test.

Indian River State College will be using the Basic Ability Test developed by Morris & McDaniel, Inc. The BAT series is designed for admission into law enforcement officer or correctional officer training. Each of these disciplines uses a unique test measuring deductive reasoning, information ordering, inductive reasoning, memorization, problem sensitivity, spatial orientation, written comprehension, and written expression. This test is given via the computer. Minimal computer skills are required – using a mouse, typing information, and scrolling up and down a computer screen.

If paying with a debit or credit card, candidates interested in taking the BAT may register and pay by choosing either the calendar or "Register Now" at the home page at <u>www.tcpublicsafetytraining.com</u>. If paying with cash or check, the candidate must appear in person at the Treasure Coast Public Safety Complex, 4600 Kirby Loop Road, Fort Pierce, to complete an online BAT application form. Payment must be made <u>prior</u> to the testing date. Space is limited to 13 candidates per testing period. The BAT test is given at the Treasure Coast Public Safety Complex, 4600 Kirby Loop Road, Fort Pierce, 4600 Kirby Loop Road, Fort Pierce.

Test Day Procedures

- Be present 15 minutes prior to your scheduled exam
- If you are late, you will have to take the test at a later date.
- No shows- Anyone not calling a head to reschedule their test date will forfeit their testing fees for that test. You will be required to repay for the test.
- Valid picture ID is required. No expired licenses will be accepted.
- Lockers are available for personal items.
- The following items are not allowed in the testing area:
 - Hats, Hairbands, etc. only barrettes, clips and hairbands that are small and thin may be permitted.
 - Jewelry wider than ¼ inch
 - o Watches
 - Cell phones, blue tooth devices or pagers. Must be turned off before storing (not just put on vibrate)
 - Hand-held computers, PDAs or other electronic devices.
 - Briefcases, backpacks or bags.
 - Notes, notebooks, study guides.

- o Calculators
- o Dictionaries
- Pens and pencils
- Food, drinks or tobacco products
- Weapons of any kind

Retesting Policy – Candidates will be allowed to re-test at the next available testing session as long as they fall within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement guidelines for retakes. **TESTING FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
