Capstone Course Guidance:

The Capstone course is an opportunity for students to integrate knowledge acquired throughout the Criminal Justice program into an original research project. For this reason, registration is limited to the final semester before graduation. Students must meet with an academic advisor in order to be registered for the Capstone course. Completion of all General Education, Technical Core, Foreign Language, and the majority of Criminal Justice courses is required prior to requesting Capstone registration. Due to the demands of the Capstone course, registration in the final term is generally limited to 12 total credits.
